

Web2jobs project is reaching its end. Third pilot of the web2jobs modules with end users successfully completed

After 2 years of hard work from a committed partnership, the web2jobs project will end on 31st December 2015.

The project has developed a Web 2.0 enhanced employability training programme for supporting unemployed adults at risk of exclusion from the labour market. The programme has been provided as a 'Train the Trainer' programme for Vocational Education, Employability and Adult Education providers on the effective use of Web 2.0 and social networking media for improving the employability of mature adult job seekers.

The final phase of the 'Train the Trainer' programme consisted in piloting the learning modules with end users - adults over 45 from disadvantaged communities – during November-December 2015. The preliminary results of this third pilot show that the end users have found the modules attractive and useful for supporting them in the job search process.

Web2jobs project was disseminated within the ICERI 2015 conference

A paper on the web2jobs project was presented within the International Conference of Education, Research and Innovation (ICERI 2015) in Seville on 16th November 2015.
